<u>History Matters/Back to the Future</u> Sallie Bingham Grant Application 2018-2019

The Sallie Bingham Grant is an award of **\$2000** to be applied towards a facultymentored student-directed reading series or full production of a play or plays written by a female playwright prior to 1965. The grant is awarded by History Matters/Back to the Future, Inc., a non-profit organization that promotes the study and production of women's plays of the past in colleges, universities, and theatres throughout the country and encourages responses to those plays from contemporary playwrights. The grant is named in honor of Sallie Bingham, a writer, teacher, feminist activist, and philanthropist who made a generous gift to History Matters/Back to the Future towards the furthering of the company's mission. Four \$2000 grants will be awarded in the 2018-19 academic year, with an additional \$500 stipend for the faculty advisor of each project.

ELIGIBILITY:

To be eligible, the application must be co-submitted by a student (preferably, the director of the proposed event) who is enrolled full-time at a university or college during the semester of his/her/their proposed production or reading series **AND** a faculty advisor. Faculty advisors, in co-submitting this application, agree to oversee the allocation of grant monies as needed and act as a liaison between student creative teams and History Matters/Back to the Future. Awarded readings or productions must take place during one of the following semesters: Fall 2018, Spring 2019, Fall 2019.

All proposed productions/reading series must be for a play or plays written before 1965 by a woman playwright. A list of plays can be found at our website: <u>www.historymattersbacktothefuture.com</u>, under "Play Library". Please note that this list is not yet comprehensive and you should feel free to submit for any play that fits the guidelines, even if it is not found on the website. <u>Preference may be given</u> <u>to less widely-produced plays.</u> The production/reading series may be either departmentally or independently sponsored. Production applications are welcome for full-length plays, one-acts, or an evening of multiple short plays. "Reading series" is defined as the presentation of two or more plays or excerpts from plays. ALL plays included in a multi-play reading or performance must adhere to the guidelines set out above. <u>We also encourage applicants to contact us with an idea for a</u> <u>comparable event that furthers the readership of historical plays by women</u>.

DEADLINE:

Applications will be accepted through April 15, 2018.

SUBMISSION GUIDELINES:

Only electronic submissions will be accepted. Applications should be sent to historymattersbacktothefuture@gmail.com. In addition to the completed Application form, please attach any supporting materials and a brief letter of

recommendation from the co-submitting faculty member. We will accept Word or PDF documents as attachments.

AWARDED PRODUCTIONS:

In the event that your reading or production is selected for the monetary award, we ask that your team (student director, faculty advisor, other member of the company or creative team, or any combination of these) submit a minimum of three (3) blog posts with at least one photo per post that document the creative process. History Matters/Back to the Future will assign deadlines for each of these posts based on the semester of your reading or production and reserves the right to copy edit posts and share them on the History Matters/Back to the Future website.

We also require that all selected readings or productions provide a program to audience members that include the History Matters/Back to the Future website and mission statement.

Finally, we encourage grant recipients to promote their event and its progress on social media platforms. We ask that you please tag History Matters/Back to the Future in all relevant posts.
